1. Visit the AACU Federal Action Center at: www.aacuweb.org/jac365
2. Scroll to the bottom of the page and in the box on the right, enter your full address.
3. Once you have entered your full address, click go or tap Enter.
4. All of your elected officials will appear, and you should select your U.S. Representative and your U.S. Senator by clicking on his or her picture.
5. Scroll to the bottom of the page to find the address and fax number for his or her Washington, DC office.
