Why Capitol Day is Important!

Help Educate & Raise Visibility

- Lots of bills are pending at the General Assembly
- Opportunity to educate about child care safety
- Urge support for child care safety legislation
- Legislative session is short 45 days in total
 - ✓ Crossover Feb. 7th (when each chamber considers the other body's bills)



What We Hope to Achieve!

Laws to Protect the Safety of Children in Child Care!

Bills we are supporting:

- Support fingerprint background checks
- Support legislation promoting child safety in license-exempt child care programs

Fingerprint Background Checks

Fingerprint background checks:

- Against state & federal records
- To promote safety & comply with fed reqs

Bills we are supporting:

- SB897 by Senator Wexton
- HB1568 by Delegate Orrock

Current Status:

- SB897- approved by Senate Rehabilitation & Social Services Committee, pending in Senate Finance
- HB1568- to be considered in the House Health, Welfare and Institutions Committee Jan 24 and referred elsewhere if approved.



3 month-old Cami Lafkin died in a child home. The police found the provider had 5 aliases with a criminal history upon a fingerprint check.

License-Exempt Care

In 2016, the General Assembly approved legislation requiring a review of VA's 14 categories of license exempt care. In December, a report was issued and recommendations were made.

Support Safety in License-Exempt Care:

To comply with the report recommendations

Bills we are supporting:

- SB1239 by Senator Hanger
- HB2259 by Delegate Filler-Corn

Current Status: No Committee action yet.



7 week-old Dylan Cummings died in a religious license exempt program. He was 1 of 10 babies who napped in cribs in a storage closet.

Stop HOA Prohibition on Child Care

Home Owner Associations sometimes prohibit child care programs from operating.

- Allow if comply with state and local law
- GA makes laws, not HOAs

Bills we are supporting:

SB1096 by Senator Petersen

Current Status:

No Action scheduled yet.
