

The Trump Rollback: Education Programs Proposed for Elimination

The Trump Administration's fiscal year 2018 budget request for the Education Department includes the elimination of three formula-allocated state grant programs, partly to pay for private school vouchers. The three programs are: Supporting Effective Instruction State Grants (ESEA Title II, Part A), 21st Century Community Learning Centers State Grants (ESEA Title IV, Part B), and Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants (HEA IV-A-3). The reauthorization of Title II, Part A under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) provides funding to assist in recruiting, hiring, and retaining effective teachers, particularly in low-income schools; to develop or improve evaluation and support systems for teachers, principals, or other school leaders; to reduce class sizes; and for high-quality, personalized professional development, particularly for educators that teach children with disabilities, including children with significant cognitive disabilities, and English learners. Title IV-B, also reauthorized under ESSA, enables communities to establish or expand centers that provide additional student learning opportunities, such as before- and after-school programs and summer school programs, aimed at improving student academic outcomes. Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants is a campus-based aid program that provides grant assistance of up to \$4,000 per academic year to undergraduate students with demonstrated financial need. The funds leverage institutional matching funds to provide even greater amounts of aid to students to help reduce financial barriers to postsecondary education.
